- What part of the sermon most stood out to you, and why?
- As you reflect on the three types of responses to Jesus' resurrection opposing, open, and embracing—which one best describes where you are right now, and what do you think God is calling you to do in response?
- The soldiers and religious leaders saw powerful evidence, yet they resisted or covered it up. What does this teach us about how pride, fear, love for money, or control can keep us from trusting in Jesus?
- The women were told "Do not be afraid," and were welcomed to see the empty tomb. Furthermore, Jesus called his failing disciples his brothers. What does this reveal about how Jesus receives those who seek him—and how might that offer comfort to you today?
- Some of the guards did not go along with the cover-up. What might Matthew be showing us through that small detail? How does that offer hope to people who are still undecided or wrestling with belief?
- Whatever posture you showed up with today—opposed to Jesus, open but unsure, or already embracing him—what do you sense your next step should be in response to the resurrection?
 - If you've been resisting Jesus, what might repentance look like today—turning from yourself to trust in him?
 - If you're open but uncertain, what would it look like to keep exploring or even take a first step of faith today?
 - If you're already trusting him, how can you respond with fresh worship, rest, obedience, or witness this week?
