SERMON NOTES

Rev. Brian Gault—May 11, 2025 "The Gospel According to Ruth" —Ruth 1:1-5

SERMON QUESTIONS

 Names matter in the OT, especially in the book of Ruth. Why is the book named the book of Ruth?

Naomi = Delightful/Sweet/Pleasant

Elimelech = My God is King

Moab = From the Father

Boaz = Strength

Ruth = Friendship

Obed = Servant

- In Ruth 1:21, Naomi expresses the grief of what she has lost by saying 'I went away full and the LORD has brought me back empty.' Discuss times and seasons of your life where you have expressed the emptiness of grief.
- How does Naomi express her faith in the midst of grief? How does that inform our faith in seasons of grief?
- How did Ruth demonstrate her covenant character in her relationship with Naomi? How did Boaz demonstrate covenant character? How do we reflect the covenant character of Ruth and Boaz?
- Ruth and Naomi were a part of the 'quartet of the vulnerable': the
 orphan, widow, poor, and sojourner. OT biblical justice has a strong
 sense of protection of and provision for the most vulnerable among
 us. How does that guide how we live as believers today?
- In Ruth 3:11, Boaz calls Ruth a 'worthy woman,' that is, a woman of strength, honor, and virtue. In the Hebrew Arrangement of the OT, why is Ruth put after Proverbs (see Prov 31), and why does the Song of Songs follow?

Job: How to Wrestle with Doubt Proverbs: How to Develop Wisdom Ruth: How to Survive Personal Difficulties

Songs: How to Enjoy Love

Ecclesiastes: How to Search for Meaning in Life

- How does the kinsman-redeemer restore Naomi's seed and land and provide for her future? How does looking to our kinsman-redeemer anchor our hope in our inheritance?
- Why is the book of Ruth in the cannon (a part of the Bible?)


