SERMON QUESTIONS

- What was most encouraging or challenging to you in this week's sermon?
- Jesus warns against the illusion of self-sufficiency. Where do you see that illusion showing up in your own life, and how might prayer recenter you?
- Why do you think Jesus teaches us to pray for daily bread instead of long-term provision? What does this teach us about trust and contentment?
- Jesus teaches us to ask for forgiveness using the language of "debts." How does this reshape your understanding of sin, repentance, and grace?
- Jesus instructs us to ask—not just for provision and pardon—but also for protection. How should the prayer "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" shape your daily awareness of spiritual danger and dependence on God?
- Jesus invites us to bring our needs to God freely. He commands us to ask! What gets in the way of asking God for what you truly need and how can you grow in bold, humble prayer?
- Jesus teaches us to address God as "Our Father." How does this reality—that we've been adopted into God's family—assure you that God hears and delights to answer your prayers?
- What is one specific way you can put this kind of prayer into practice this week—not just learning *about* prayer, but actually *praying* in honest, daily dependence on your Father?
