SERMON QUESTIONS

Questions about the text:

- What were the five ways Paul says the Gentiles were separated from God in verse 12?
- What do the words “But now in Christ Jesus...” (v.13) tell us about the shift from separation to salvation?
- According to Paul, how does Jesus bring peace between us and God—and between one another?
- What does Paul mean by “breaking down the dividing wall of hostility”? (v.14)
- What do the images of “citizens,” “household,” and “holy temple” in verses 19–22 reveal about our new identity in Christ?

Application Questions

- Why do you think Paul urges us to *remember* who we were before Christ saved us?
- How does remembering your own story of separation and grace shape the way you treat others at Redeemer?
- Where in your life are you tempted to rebuild dividing walls—especially toward those from different cultures, classes, or backgrounds?
- Redeemer Church longs to reflect the unity and diversity of God’s kingdom. What’s one intentional step you can take to pursue unity across racial, cultural, or generational lines?
- Who in our church might feel like an outsider? How could you reflect the welcome of Christ toward them this week?

Questions for Children & Youth

- What does it mean that Jesus brings us close to God—even when we were far away?
- Who is someone at church or school or camp you can be kind to because Jesus has been kind to you?

Praying Biblical Prayers

Prayer is a vital part of the Christian life. At times we pray alone, on Sundays we pray together in corporate worship, and other times we gather to pray in small groups. As Martin Luther once said, "Let us pray—in the church, with the church, for the church!"

This summer, in our joint adult Sunday School class, we'll explore prayers found throughout Scripture—a lament in Psalm 13, a prayer of corporate repentance in Nehemiah 9, the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6, a prayer of faith and praise in Habakkuk, and more. Through these passages, we'll consider how the content and tone of biblical prayers can shape our own rhythms of prayer. Each week, we'll conclude our time by praying one of these prayers together. Our hope is that as we open God's word and lift our voices in prayer, he would deepen our dependence on him and renew our daily habit of seeking him in all things.

Martin Luther described the Psalms as "a little Bible" in which everything that is in the entire Bible is comprehended most beautifully and briefly. Each week we will unpack a different psalm, discovering how it guides us in honest prayer, worship and trust. All middle school and high school students are invited to join us this summer as we reflect on the Psalms and deepen our relationship with God.

We will be doing a joint class, so middle school and high school will be together!

This summer, during our six-week Sunday School series, children will explore foundational truths about God, Creation, and God's Law using the New City Catechism.
