SERMON QUESTIONS

- Looking back at Genesis 39:21-40:1, why is it important not to separate Joseph's prison experience from the statement that "the LORD was with him and showed him steadfast love"? How does this reshape our view of suffering?
- In what ways do we, like Joseph, struggle to live faithfully when our circumstances don't change? Which of Joseph's lessons (faithfulness, dependence, truthfulness, forgiveness, patience) do you feel God is forming in you right now?
- Why do you think God often uses "middle acts"—seasons of trials, waiting, and obscurity—to transform His people? How have you seen Him use this in your life?
- Joseph longed for vindication and freedom, but God gave him transformation first. How do our desires for change (job, marriage, health, etc.)
 sometimes overshadow what God wants to do in us before He works for us?
- How does Jesus embody the qualities Joseph learned in prison (faithfulness, dependence, truth-telling, forgiveness, patience)? How does that encourage us when we feel weak in our middle acts?
- What hope do Psalms 30:5 and 34:19 give us about God's deliverance?
 How does remembering the "final act" of God's story (resurrection, new creation) help us endure our own "middle acts"?
- How can we hold together the hope that God sometimes brings real change
 in this life (new job, restored marriage, healing, reconciliation) with the
 greater hope that even if those changes never come, His final deliverance in
 Christ is guaranteed? How does this shape the way we pray and wait in our
 own middle acts?

Sermon Points

Big idea: Genesis 40 shows us Joseph in the "middle act" of his story. The middle act is the long season between promise and fulfillment. Though forgotten by men, he was not forgotten by God. The Lord's steadfast love (Genesis 39:21) was at work the whole time: working in him to grow faithfulness, dependence, patience, truthfulness, and forgiveness, and working for him to set the stage for his eventual exaltation. And the same is true for us: in the waiting seasons of life, God's love is never idle. He lovingly works in us and for us, until the day He brings us into His final deliverance.

- The Lord's steadfast love is at work in the middle act.

Habits of the Household

Based on Justin Whitmel Earley's *Habits of the Household*, this class explores how everyday family routines can be transformed into intentional practices of spiritual formation.

Over seven weeks, we examine key habits—waking, mealtimes, discipline, screen time, family devotions, work, and bedtime—considering how each can shape both parents and children in the way of Christ. Participants will reflect on their own household rhythms, engage in group discussion, and be challenged to implement small but meaningful changes rooted in grace.

Each session pairs practical ideas with biblical wisdom, aiming to cultivate habits that form hearts, not just behaviors. This class is ideal for parents, caregivers, and anyone seeking to integrate faith into the ordinary moments of family life.

In Pursuit of Biblical Creativity Teacher: Andy Sauerwein Location: Room 109

Romans 12 compels us to "offer our bodies as living sacrifices" in the pursuit of God's good purpose, rather than being "conformed to the pattern of this world." Genesis 1 calls us to participate as stewards by imitating God's creative demonstration, "putting things into good order."

In this class, we will seek to inhabit a framework for navigating this pursuit of "good order." We will consider our roles as explorers, makers, and participants in God's eternal purpose as he forms (and re-forms) our affections to resonate with his desires. Through our "creative activity," we can "taste and see that the Lord is good" by imaginatively pursuing beauty, goodness, and truth in every area of our lives, doing all that we do "as unto the Lord."
