#### SERMON QUESTIONS

- Contrast Joseph's life in Genesis 37-40 with 41. What is different about him in our chapter this morning?
- Would you agree that Joseph, who had suffered immensely, seems to be flourishing in our text? Can you remember a time when the Lord lifted you out of a dark season?
- While it's tempting to think Joseph is now out of the woods in Genesis 41, why is it more accurate to see that while he's out of the woods of hardship, chapter 41 introduces him to new forest he'd need to navigate well?
- Pharaoh appears to be at the center of everything transpiring in verses 41-45! What might Pharaoh be doing (directly or indirectly) by giving Joseph a new name, a new look, new clothing, new power, and a new wife? How might this have introduced temptation in Joseph's heart towards complete assimilation?
- In the sermon, CS Lewis' Inner Ring was referenced. When have you been guilty of chasing some access into a man-made inner ring, only to tarnish your unique Christian identity?
- It appears that Joseph was at the center of everything in verses 46-49 and 53-57! How might this have introduced temptation in Joseph's heart towards pride? When have you, on the heels of success, been tempted to forget the Lord?
- In the end, Joseph maintains his unique identity in Egypt. While he is in Egypt, he is not of Egypt. What evidence do we have in this text to support this? Joseph also maintains a deep sense of humility. What evidence do we have in this text to support this?
- Hebrews 11:22 reminds us that Joseph was a man of deep faith in the Lord. As these things are unfolding, his hope and trust remains in God's promises, presence, and Gospel. How does the Gospel of Christ, the good news of the greater Joseph, help us deal with prosperous times? How does the grace of Christ keep us, even when we fail? How does the Holy Spirit work in us, moving us to remember who we are and whose we are in this life?

## Sermon Points:

- 1. Highly exalted and successful.
- 2. Hidden dangers of assimilation and pride.
- 3. Helped by God and the Gospel to persevere.





# What are Care Teams?

Care Teams are a new initiative to help our church be attentive and responsive to the needs of the Body. Here's a brief overview of what it will mean for you as a church member:

- Each member will still have an assigned elder: a leader in the church who is available to you and responsible for your spiritual shepherding
- Each elder will now be joined by a Care Team of deacons, men, and women in our congregation.
- One member of the Care Team (your Care Advocate) will be assigned to you to pray for and check-in with you regularly.

Habits of the Household

Based on Justin Whitmel Earley's *Habits of the Household*, this class explores how everyday family routines can be transformed into intentional practices of spiritual formation.

Over seven weeks, we examine key habits—waking, mealtimes, discipline, screen time, family devotions, work, and bedtime—considering how each can shape both parents and children in the way of Christ. Participants will reflect on their own household rhythms, engage in group discussion, and be challenged to implement small but meaningful changes rooted in grace.

Each session pairs practical ideas with biblical wisdom, aiming to cultivate habits that form hearts, not just behaviors. This class is ideal for parents, caregivers, and anyone seeking to integrate faith into the ordinary moments of family life.

# In Pursuit of Biblical Creativity Teacher: Andy Sauerwein Location: Room 109

Romans 12 compels us to "offer our bodies as living sacrifices" in the pursuit of God's good purpose, rather than being "conformed to the pattern of this world." Genesis 1 calls us to participate as stewards by imitating God's creative demonstration, "putting things into good order."

In this class, we will seek to inhabit a framework for navigating this pursuit of "good order." We will consider our roles as explorers, makers, and participants in God's eternal purpose as he forms (and re-forms) our affections to resonate with his desires. Through our "creative activity," we can "taste and see that the Lord is good" by imaginatively pursuing beauty, goodness, and truth in every area of our lives, doing all that we do "as unto the Lord."

The book of Acts is the story of the ascent of Jesus Christ, the descent of the Spirit, and the dawn of the church. Through studying Acts, God's people see firsthand how God formed and sustained a new people under the administration of the new covenant. There is much in this book to teach us about the Holy Spirit, church life, living amidst persecution, unity in diversity, and ultimately about Christ Himself. In this class we will explore the biblical - theological categories of Acts and hope to mine the riches of the wisdom of this book for living faithfully under King Jesus in our own context.
