Question 1: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

SERMON QUESTIONS

1. James says we will “meet” trials, they’re inevitable. How does viewing trials as certain (rather than surprising or abnormal) change the way you respond when they arrive?
2. The sermon highlighted that both lack and prosperity can be spiritually dangerous. Which kind of trial tends to test your faith more: absence (loss) or abundance (blessing)? Why?
3. How would you define a trial? Do you agree with the following working definition, would you revise it? “A trial is any God-permitted circumstance—painful or pleasant—that tests our faith, obedience, and loves, often exposing what is real.”
4. Have you ever faced a trial so intense it felt unsurvivable? James says trials are in fact survivable—by God’s grace. The sermon unpacked four habits we should master during trials. Do you remember them?
 - a. We must know.
 - b. We must ask.
 - c. We must look to Jesus.
 - d. We can then count it all joy.
5. What are ways you can work these habits into your own life?
6. James promises that trials faced God’s way will produce maturity and steadfastness. Can you think of examples in other spheres of life where heat, pain, or resistance leads to purification, healing, or strength? How does this help us understand the impact of trials on our faith?
7. Who are people you consider truly godly (in your life, or from history)? What do you think God used to form them? How have trials played a role in their growth?
8. Where did this sermon deepen your appreciation for the gospel? Where were you moved toward gratitude for what Christ has done, and how does that shape your life right now?

The Song of Songs is perhaps the most neglected and misunderstood book in the Christian Bible, but we need to hear its message more than ever in our current cultural moment. The Song upholds the beauty of the marriage covenant as instituted by God in Genesis 2, while helping us to navigate the hardships, temptations, and brokenness of the post-fall Genesis 3 world we now inhabit. In this class, we will consider the topic of marriage and marital intimacy from the larger context of the Bible through the lens of Solomon's most famous song, the Song of Songs.
