## SERMON POINTS

1. The Resurrection of Jesus Does Not Free Us from Affliction in This Life
2. The Resurrection of Jesus Does Secure Our Future Hope and Home
3. The Resurrection of Jesus Provides Us with Present Help to Live Holy Lives

## SERMON QUESTIONS

1. Paul is honest that the resurrection of Jesus does not remove affliction from the Christian life. What is the heaviest thing you are carrying right now? Have you brought it honestly before God?
2. Paul uses the image of a tent to describe our bodies and our present existence. In what ways have you felt the fragility of the tent, physically, emotionally, and spiritually? How has that fragility affected your faith?
3. The resurrection of Christ secures our future body, our eternal home, and our dwelling with God forever. In what ways has your suffering made you long not just for relief, but for God himself?
4. The Holy Spirit is God's present down payment of the resurrection age, which is here but not yet in its fullness. Where in your life do you see his presence, power, and work?
5. Read through 2 Corinthians 4:16 through 5:11 and underline every command you find. It would be wrong to think any of them can be obeyed apart from the Holy Spirit. He is our Helper. How might you pray for the Spirit to help you fix your eyes on what is unseen rather than what is seen? How might the Spirit be working, in cooperation with your daily habits, to renew your inner man?
6. The same Spirit that renews you daily also compels you toward people who are dying without Christ. Who in your life needs to hear that they can be reconciled to God? What is stopping you from telling them?
7. Today you heard that Christ died for your sins, was buried, and on the third day was raised. He is the block that holds everything together. Without him there is no forgiveness, no future, and no hope. If you have never surrendered your life to Jesus Christ, what is stopping you today? He is not just the foundation of Christianity. He can be the foundation of your life. Reach out to us. We would love to talk with you.

### ***Generous Justice***

This seven-week Sunday School class explores the core themes of Tim Keller's *Generous Justice* and how they shape a lived, biblical vision of mercy, righteousness, and neighbor-love. Together we will examine the Scripture's call to *mishpat* (justice) and *tzadeqah* (righteousness) in daily life, learning how God's grace motivates compassion rather than guilt or duty.

Each week connects Keller's insights to practical areas such as caring for the poor, addressing social and racial inequities, cultivating cross-cultural relationships, and integrating personal responsibility with concern for systems that harm the vulnerable. Participants will engage in discussion, reflection, and real-life application, discovering how the gospel empowers believers to seek restoration in their communities and embody God's heart for justice with humility, wisdom, and generosity.

### ***Covenant Theology***

**Location:** Sanctuary

This class will explore the riches of covenant theology and how it shapes the way Reformed Christians read the Bible. Scripture repeatedly reveals God's covenant promise: "I will be your God, and you will be my people" (Ex 6:7).

Over seven weeks, we will trace this theme through the major covenants of the Bible using insights from J. V. Fesko's book *Signed, Sealed, Delivered*. The series will introduce the foundations of covenant theology and examine the covenant of redemption, the covenant of works, and God's covenant of grace in both the Old and New Covenants. We will also consider covenant signs and the relationship between covenant and the church. Our prayer is that this class will help participants see more clearly the beauty of Scripture and the richness of God's relationship with His people.
