Sermon Points

As a Holy Nation, we are not alone.
And as a people for God's possession, we are not our own.

- We belong to God:
 - As God Speaks about us (9, 10b)
 - Chosen Race
 - Royal Priesthood
 - **Holy Nation**
 - **People for God's Possession**
 - As we speak about God (10a)
 - Proclaim His Excellencies

Sermon Questions

- I. Belonging to a Holy Nation tempers our hearts against the groups that most call for our primary allegiance, whether national, ethnic, political, or cultural. Which rival allegiance/group in your life is most likely to try to tell you who you are, and what would it look like to hold that more loosely?
- II. The Heidelberg Catechism (based on Titus 2:11-14, 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, among many other scriptures) describes the reality that "I am not my own" as "our only comfort in life and death." Yet, we may hear that as a loss rather than a relief. What would need to shift in how you think about belonging for that phrase to feel like freedom?
- III. Where have you experienced the exhaustion of self-sovereignty—the burden of having to generate your own meaning, prove your own worth, or assure yourself that you are okay? How does belonging to God and being called out of darkness and into the light of the gospel change your perspective?
- IV. Peter closes with a call to "proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light." What would it look like, in your ordinary relationships this week, for your belonging to God to be visible to someone who doesn't yet have it?

Fall Sunday School Begins Aug 9 **Adult Classes Block 1 (Aug 9—Sept 27):**

Redemption Accomplished, WCF 8-15

Teacher: Brian Gault

This fall, our Sunday School class will explore Chapters 8–15 of the Westminster Confession of Faith, tracing the heart of the gospel and the saving work of Christ. Over seven weeks we will consider how God rescues sinners through the person and work of Jesus and applies that redemption to His people by the Holy Spirit.

Topics include Christ the Mediator, human will and sin, effectual calling, justification, adoption, sanctification, saving faith, and repentance. Together these chapters present a beautiful picture of God's grace—from Christ accomplishing salvation to the Spirit bringing that salvation to life in believers. Whether you are new to the Confession or familiar with it already, this class will help deepen your understanding of the gospel and strengthen your confidence in the saving grace of Christ.

The Righteousness of God: Romans 1-5

In this Sunday School class, we aim to use Romans 1-5 to paint a clear picture of the unrighteousness of man, the righteousness of God, and the way in which this righteousness is imputed to those who believe in Christ. In these five chapters, Paul gives arguably the clearest exposition in the Bible of how we sinners are made righteous by the death and resurrection of Christ. We hope that, after this class, all who attend will leave with a clearer understanding of the righteousness we have in Christ, the divine indicative that serves as a foundation for all divine imperatives.

Redeeming the Time: Parenting as Spiritual Formation

In this class, we hope to focus less on behavior and discipline and more on the formation of our children - heart, mind, soul, and strength. This fall Redeemer Youth Sunday School will be working through *Confronting Christianity: 12 Hard Questions for the World's Largest Religion* by Rebecca McLaughlin. From the back of the book:

"Christianity is the most widespread global belief system, and promises to remain so well into the future. But for many educated westerners, biblical Christianity is a dangerous idea—challenging some of their deepest beliefs. Channeling state-of-the-art research, personal stories, and careful biblical study, *Confronting Christianity* explores 12 questions that keep many of us from considering faith in Christ. Look more closely, McLaughlin argues, and the reality of suffering, the complexity of sexuality, the desire for diversity, the success of science, and other seeming roadblocks to faith become signposts. Jesus becomes not a relic from the ancient world, but our modern world's best hope."
