Sermon Points

1. The Gospel declared (verses 1–5)
2. The Gospel on the brink of being deserted (verses 6–7)
3. The Gospel defended (to lovingly draw us back to God) (verses 8–9)

Sermon Questions

1. Read Galatians 1:1–9 aloud. What is Paul's tone here? What clues in the text tell us things are pretty serious?
2. After identifying himself as the writer, Paul packs the essential aspects of the gospel into a few short verses!
—Verse 3: What is resting upon this church when this was written? Did it depend on how they were doing in that present moment?
What is the importance of Paul calling God "our Father?" Paul is a Jew. This church is a Gentile church! What does this say about the family of God?
—Verse 4: What did Christ give, and for what reasons? What did He deliver us from, and what has He brought us into? What motivated Him to do so?
—Verse 1: Who raised Him from the dead?
So, is the gospel a list of what we must do, or the announcement of what God has already done? And why does Paul lead with all of this before confronting anything they are doing?
3. Paul normally begins his letters to churches with a formal greeting and then gratitude (see the opening chapters of Romans, Colossians, Ephesians, Philippians, and 1 Thessalonians). He even does it in 1 Corinthians, of all churches! The introduction to Galatians lacks this. What does that absence tell you?
4. Paul doesn't say they are deserting a message (though they are). He says they are deserting "him who called you" (v. 6)—God himself! Why can't these two things be separated? What is actually at stake, then, when we add anything to Christ?
5. Finish this sentence honestly: "I feel right with God when I have Christ plus _____. " Performance? Feelings? Someone's approval? There is a corporate version of this in churches, too. Where do we ask people to embrace Christ plus preferences God has left to Christian liberty? (Careful here: preference is not sin.)
6. Paul pronounces a curse, anathema, on anyone who distorts the gospel, starting with himself (v. 8–9). We might also say those who turn completely from the gospel place themselves in the realm of the cursed ones. Now turn to Galatians 3:13: Christ became a curse for us. Why is that good news for the drifter? And for the person who, in ignorance, has taught something less than grace?
7. Something this week will test whether you and I are actually resting in the gospel of Christ: a temptation, a failure, or a day that goes badly. The false gospel says hide, compensate, try harder, or earn God's approval. The true gospel says run to the Father and rest in what Christ has done because the curse you deserve has already been carried. How does that move us, with the Spirit's help, toward greater delight in Christ and greater power over this evil age and its passions?

Fall Sermon Series Introduction from Pastor El:

We will spend the next 13 weeks unpacking the book of Galatians. In this letter, we'll see four great truths again and again. I've intentionally framed them all to begin with the letter "R" to help us remember them. Through the perfect life, substitutionary death, and resurrection of Christ, God has rescued us from our sins and this present evil age. He has re-familied us, fulfilling His promises to Abraham by forming one family in Christ from Jew and Gentile, male and female, slave and free. He has released us from every form of slavery—the law, the fear of man, bondage to sin, and our inclination to add anything to the Gospel of Christ. And He is re-creating us by His Spirit into a new creation, producing a life the law never could.

LAST Day for Officer Nominations, Aug 9

Qualified men will meet the standards set for Deacon or Elder in 1 Tim 3 and Titus 1, of the appropriate age (Deacon 25, Elder 35), and a member for at least one year as of Feb 2027. A candidate must receive two nominations (not from family members) to be a valid nominee. All officers must be able to receive and adopt our Confessional Standards and form of government. Redemption Accomplished, WCF 8-15

This fall, our Sunday School class will explore Chapters 8–15 of the Westminster Confession of Faith, tracing the heart of the gospel and the saving work of Christ. Over seven weeks we will consider how God rescues sinners through the person and work of Jesus and applies that redemption to His people by the Holy Spirit.

Topics include Christ the Mediator, human will and sin, effectual calling, justification, adoption, sanctification, saving faith, and repentance. Together these chapters present a beautiful picture of God's grace—from Christ accomplishing salvation to the Spirit bringing that salvation to life in believers. Whether you are new to the Confession or familiar with it already, this class will help deepen your understanding of the gospel and strengthen your confidence in the saving grace of Christ.
