Why Do We Baptize the Children of Believers?

God's Covenant with His People

In the Reformed tradition, infant baptism is grounded in the Bible's unified teaching about God's covenant of grace. From the beginning, God has graciously committed himself to redeeming a people for himself through His promises. He has also given covenant signs to mark those who belong to his visible covenant community. The coming of Christ does not overturn this pattern; it fulfills it. God established his covenant with Abraham, saying, "I will establish my covenant between you and me and your offspring after you throughout their generations... to be God to you and to your offspring after you" (Gen 17:7). The covenant sign was circumcision, given not only to believing adults but also to their infant sons (Gen 17:10–12). Circumcision pointed beyond itself to the righteousness that comes by faith (Rom 4:11).

Circumcision, Baptism, and Judgment

There is another important dimension to these covenant signs. Circumcision was a cutting that pictured the judgment and curse deserved by the covenant-breaker. It pointed to the seriousness of sin and the necessity of being delivered from its curse through God's provision. The same pattern helps us understand baptism. Throughout Scripture, water is associated with both judgment and salvation. The waters of the flood brought judgment upon the wicked, while God brought his people safely through the Red Sea. In baptism, these themes converge: the waters picture Christ's own passage through death and judgment on behalf of his people, and our identification with him in that judgment (Rom 6:3–4; 1 Pet 3:20–21).

Baptized into Christ

Baptism is, at its heart, a baptism into Christ—into his death, burial, and resurrection. The water itself does not wash away sin, regenerate a person, or guarantee salvation. Rather, baptism visibly proclaims the gospel: the way of salvation is not around judgment but through it, because Christ bore judgment in the place of his people. Baptism pictures our union with Christ in his death and resurrection. The sign points us away from ourselves and toward the Savior who died and rose again so that all who are united to him by faith might have life.

Why Baptize Infants?

Because God has not changed the covenantal pattern by which he addresses believers and their children. At Pentecost, Peter proclaimed, "The promise is for you and for your children" (Acts 2:39). The New Testament also records the baptism of households (Acts 16:15, 33; 1 Cor 1:16). These passages do not explicitly tell us that infants were present, but they fit the broader biblical pattern in which God includes the children of his people within the visible covenant community.

Infant baptism, therefore, is not a declaration that a child is already regenerate or certainly saved. Baptized children, like everyone else, must personally repent and believe in Christ. Baptism is a sign and seal of God's covenant promise, placing the gospel before the child from the beginning and calling him or her to embrace Christ by faith.

Look to Christ

When we witness a baptism at Redeemer Church, we should look first to Christ. Baptism reminds us that salvation comes through judgment because Christ endured judgment for his people. It points us to his death and resurrection, his covenant faithfulness, and the promise of eternal life for all who are united to Him by faith.

Sermon Points

- I. The spell is acknowledged (v.1)
- II. The spell is disrupted (vv.2-5)
- III. The spell begins to break through Scripture (vv.6-9)

Sermon Questions

- Have you ever gone through a season when things you once believed clearly about God, the gospel, or yourself became harder to see? Why do you think Christians can sometimes lose our way, even after we have genuinely believed the gospel?
- In Galatians 3:1, Paul reminds them that Christ crucified had been clearly preached before their eyes. What had they begun to believe that made Christ seem insufficient? Where are we tempted to add something to Jesus?
- Paul does not abandon the Galatians when they become disoriented. He presses in as a loving family member. Who has God used in your life to help you see clearly when you were losing your way? Who might God be calling you to love in that way now, letting them “borrow” some of your present stability?
- In verses 2–5, Paul keeps pointing the Galatians back to what God had already done in them by his Spirit. Why is it important to remember God’s past work in our lives? How can remembering what the Spirit has already done help us when the present feels confusing or disorienting?
- The prophets promised that God would pour out his Spirit and transform his people from within. Elsewhere Scripture describes this as a circumcision of the heart. How does the gift of the Spirit help us understand what outward circumcision was pointing toward? Why does this matter for Paul’s argument that the Galatians do not need something added to Christ?
- When Paul confronts the false teaching, he finally opens Scripture and goes back through Abraham’s story. How does Genesis 12, Genesis 15, and Genesis 17 expose the false story the Galatians were beginning to believe? What does this teach us about the importance of Scripture when other stories begin to feel more believable than the gospel?
- Where are you having difficulty trusting God right now? What would it look like this week to look outside yourself, return to what God has said and done in Christ, remember the Spirit’s work in you, and trust him again (or for the first time)?

Redemption Accomplished, WCF 8-15

Location: Fellowship Hall

This fall, our Sunday School class will explore Chapters 8–15 of the Westminster Confession of Faith, tracing the heart of the gospel and the saving work of Christ. Over seven weeks we will consider how God rescues sinners through the person and work of Jesus and applies that redemption to His people by the Holy Spirit.

Topics include Christ the Mediator, human will and sin, effectual calling, justification, adoption, sanctification, saving faith, and repentance. Together these chapters present a beautiful picture of God's grace—from Christ accomplishing salvation to the Spirit bringing that salvation to life in believers. Whether you are new to the Confession or familiar with it already, this class will help deepen your understanding of the gospel and strengthen your confidence in the saving grace of Christ.

The Righteousness of God: Romans 1-5

In this Sunday School class, we aim to use Romans 1-5 to paint a clear picture of the unrighteousness of man, the righteousness of God, and the way in which this righteousness is imputed to those who believe in Christ. In these five chapters, Paul gives arguably the clearest exposition in the Bible of how we sinners are made righteous by the death and resurrection of Christ. We hope that after this class, all who attend will leave with a clearer understanding of the righteousness we have in Christ, the divine indicative that serves as a foundation for all divine imperatives.

Redeeming the Time: Parenting as Spiritual Formation

This fall Redeemer Youth Sunday School will be working through *Confronting Christianity: 12 Hard Questions for the World's Largest Religion* by Rebecca McLaughlin. From the back of the book:

"Christianity is the most widespread global belief system, and promises to remain so well into the future. But for many educated westerners, biblical Christianity is a dangerous idea—challenging some of their deepest beliefs. Channeling state-of-the-art research, personal stories, and careful biblical study, *Confronting Christianity* explores 12 questions that keep many of us from considering faith in Christ. Look more closely, McLaughlin argues, and the reality of suffering, the complexity of sexuality, the desire for diversity, the success of science, and other seeming roadblocks to faith become signposts.
